The Yarmouth Shark Scramble is a World Class Shark Fishing Tournament held in the town of Yarmouth, in South West Nova Scotia. This three-day event is for all ages, and includes waterfront activities, local music and the opportunity to see some of the largest sharks caught in the Atlantic Ocean. This tournament holds the Canadian record for the Largest Shortfin Mako shark caught by rod and reel at 1089 pounds, landed in 2004.

This tournament is also a large supporter for our local Department of Fisheries and Oceans assisting in collections of science information and the TAG & RELEASE program.

84 undersized sharks were tagged and released by fishermen who took tagging kits:

74 blue sharks in total (40 males, 9 females, 25 unknown)

9 porbeagle sharks in total (4 males, 4 females, 1 unknown)

1 Mako shark (male)
